



## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### SUBMISSION OF SCIENTIFIC PAPERS

By submitting a scientific paper through the official platform of the Latin American Congress of Assisted Reproduction – REDLARA, the author responsible for the submission (hereinafter, the "**Author**") declares to have read, understood, and fully accepted these Terms and Conditions. Acceptance of these terms is **mandatory** to complete the submission process. The Author declares that they understand and agree to comply with all provisions established below.

#### 1. Declaration of Originality and Content

- 1.1. The submitted work must be original, unpublished, and must not have been previously presented or published in any medium, except for cases expressly permitted by the call for papers.
- 1.2. The Author declares that the content of the work is honest, truthful, and does not infringe upon the rights of third parties, including intellectual property, copyright, confidentiality, or patient rights.
- 1.3. The content of the work is the sole responsibility of the authors and does not necessarily reflect the opinion of REDLARA, the Scientific Committee, or the Congress organization.
- 1.4. The Author guarantees that they have the authorization of all co-authors to submit the work and that all co-authors have approved its final content.

#### 2. Authorship Conflicts

- 2.1. The Author performing the submission declares that all co-authors have approved the content and presentation of the work and have given their consent to appear as such.
- 2.2. The Congress organization will not intervene in authorship disputes.
- 2.3. In the event of a conflict between authors, it is the responsibility of the home institutions or entities to resolve such discrepancies.



### 3. Compliance with REDLARA Rules

- 3.1. The work must strictly comply with the **Instructions for Authors** published by REDLARA, including structure, length, language, format, number of tables, and anonymization criteria.
- 3.2. Total or partial non-compliance with these rules may lead to the **automatic disqualification of the work** at any stage of the process, without the right to claim.

### 4. Evaluation Process and Scientific Committee Decision

- 4.1. All papers will undergo a peer-review process conducted by evaluators with scientific experience and competence in the corresponding subject.
- 4.2. The evaluation process is **anonymous**; therefore, the identity of the authors will not be visible to the evaluators, and vice versa.
- 4.3. The Scientific Committee is responsible for grading, selecting, or rejecting papers based on scientific, methodological, and thematic relevance criteria, and is not obliged to provide detailed justifications for its decision.
- 4.4. The Author expressly accepts that the **decision of the REDLARA Scientific Committee is final, definitive, and unappealable**.
- 4.5. Requests for reconsideration, appeal, or additional review of rejected papers will not be accepted, regardless of the reason.
- 4.6. REDLARA is not obliged to provide detailed reports or individual justifications regarding evaluation results.

### 5. Disqualification and Withdrawal/Modification of Papers

- 5.1. Papers may not be withdrawn or modified after the submission period has closed, except in exceptional circumstances justified and approved by the Scientific Committee.
- 5.2. REDLARA reserves the right to reject, withdraw, or disqualify a work at any time if it detects:
  - 5.2.1. Non-compliance with established rules.
  - 5.2.2. False or misleading information.
  - 5.2.3. Lack of anonymization.
  - 5.2.4. Authorship conflicts.
  - 5.2.5. Non-compliance with ethical or scientific principles.
- 5.3. Disqualification will not give rise to claims, compensation, or refunds.



## **6. Ethics, Confidentiality, and Best Practices**

- 6.1.** The Author declares that the work complies with national and international ethical standards, including informed consent, data confidentiality, and approval by ethics committees where applicable.
- 6.2.** No information allowing the identification of institutions, professionals, or patients shall be included during the evaluation stage.
- 6.3.** REDLARA may request additional clarifications if it deems it necessary to verify the ethical compliance of the work.
- 6.4.** The Author agrees to respect the Congress Code of Conduct and any additional scientific integrity or conflict of interest policies defined by the event organization.

## **7. Publication and Distribution Rights**

- 7.1.** By submitting the work, the Author authorizes REDLARA to publish, reproduce, distribute, and archive the accepted abstract in:
  - 7.1.1.** The Congress abstract book.
  - 7.1.2.** The REDLARA digital platform.
  - 7.1.3.** Scientific material associated with the event.
  - 7.1.4.** Publications linked to REDLARA, including selection processes for affiliated scientific journals.
- 7.2.** This authorization is granted on a non-exclusive basis and without financial compensation.
- 7.3.** The Author guarantees they have all the necessary rights to grant such permissions and that no conflict exists with other publications or contractual obligations.

## **8. Registration and Presentation**

- 8.1.** Acceptance of the work is conditioned upon at least one of the authors completing their registration for the Congress within the established deadlines.
- 8.2.** The Author commits to presenting the work in the modality, date, and time assigned by the organization.
- 8.3.** Failure to present the work may affect the author's participation in future REDLARA calls for papers.
